

Announcing auditions for *Two Altars, Ten Funerals* by Erik Ehn
a Spring workshop production directed by Dor Atkinson.

Auditions will take place on Thursday, November 19, 5–8 PM, in Rehearsal Room 201 in Theatre 101. Callbacks TBA.

Please prepare one 1–2 minute contemporary monologue, memorized.

Those auditioning are asked to sign up for a 5 minute time slot between 5:00 and 6:20pm on Thursday, November 19th to perform their monologues. From 6:30–8:00pm some actors may be asked to return to Rehearsal Room 201 in Theatre 101 for movement and cold readings.

Please read the script in advance of auditions.

Please bring current headshot and acting resume to auditions.

Please be dressed for movement.

This workshop production will be presented March 25–27, 2010. Rehearsals to begin in the last week of January 2010. It is our good fortune that a few rehearsals will coincide with a departmental visitation by playwright Erik Ehn, who will be a guest teacher for Graduate Colloquium.

In this episodic, surreal one-act play, a little girl from Seattle and a little girl from Guatemala mystically communicate to one another through two altars they build in honor of All Souls Day. Edit shares the stories of her community, and Chloe, who lives with her Grandad, comes to understand the experience of grief, both the personal and the large and seemingly unfathomable.

Casting needs:

Edit – Latina/ Hispanic actress, can play 12–13 years old

Chloe – non-Latina/ Hispanic actress, can play 12 years old

Grandad – can play older man, 65+, same ethnicity as Chloe

Ghost #1 – an actor or actress who can transform into multiple roles

Ghost #2 – an actor or actress who can transform into multiple roles
